- Proper spacing and dryer soil conditions help keep leaves/plants a manageable size.
- High light is recommended during all stages of Stachys production.

CONSUMER APPEAL

- Certainly one of the most tactile plant on the market. The soft fuzzy leaves are the perfect way to engage children in a retail center and in the garden.
- In addition to its attractive foliage, the purplish blooms of 'Silver Carpet' help to attract butterflies and bees. Its fuzzy foliage is unappealing to deer and rabbits.

GARDEN ATTRIBUTES

- Although Somewhat unorthodox, the foliage of lamb's ear could potentially be used in cut flower arrangements as a novel accent piece.
- A very urban and pollution tolerant plant, 'Silver Carpet' works well as a groundcover in small areas, as a border edging, in rock gardens, or even in containers.
- 'Silver Carpet' is tough as nails surviving in dry and rocky soils though it can tolerate heavier soils if not overwatered. Additionally, this plant has proven resistant to the allelopathic biochemicals produced by black walnut trees.
- Overhead watering should be avoided because the fuzzy foliage takes extra time to dry. If the foliage is kept consistently wet and not allowed to dry out, disease may occur.
