TIPS

- The amount of shade the developing cuttings receive should be reduced as they develop.
- A neutral DIF, moderate light, and reduced phosphorous nitrate fertilizers (Such as a 15-0-15 rotating with 20-10-20) are suggested to control stretch. Shade cloth may need to be drawn over the trays to reduce temperature stress during the middle of the d
- Lysimachia can root at any node making both tip and node cuttings viable.

TIPS

- Ammonia based fertilizers will lower the soil pH and cause boron and iron uptake deficiencies.
- If not pinched in propagation, a finishing pinch is suggested to promote branching.
- Lysimachia are flat and trailing in habit so they work best in combos as the trailing component.
- If grown too densely packed, the runners will root into adjacent pots causing damage when separated from the tray. Ensure pots are properly spaced.

- Although this plant has no significant blooms to speak of, it more than makes up for this shortcoming with fantastic golden foliage that perfectly contrasts almost any flower.

GARDEN ATTRIBUTES

- Lysimachia is a wonderfully versatile tender perennial comfortable in containers, shady groundcover locations (even under trees and shrubs), shaded rock gardens, rain gardens, along ponds, and much more.
- Tolerant of wet to well drained soils. Can handle heavy clay and competition with tree root systems once established. Drought tolerant once established.
- Unless grown under absolutely ideal conditions, creeping Jenny is not dense enough to smother weeds.
